Hello everyone, this week's article will be about the need for an increase in Rec Dues. The Recreational Association Board of Directors is requesting an increase of \$5.00 in the monthly assessment, changing it from \$75.00 to \$80.00 every month. The last time the membership voted YES to increase the dues was 2014. If approved, the increase would be effective January 2019. The following is an explanation and list of reasons for the requested dues increase.

First and foremost, the increase in assessment from \$75.00 to \$80.00 will be used to cover operating expense short-fall.

The operating expenses have risen considerably over the past years. Contractors are charging more for their services, and parts and materials are costing more. The contracts for the Golf Course Maintenance, Gardening, Pool and Janitorial have all increased. The Janitorial contract is approximately \$70,000. The Gardening contract is approximately \$90,000. In an effort to stay even with these increases and maintain the Recreational Facilities in a manner that will be satisfactory to the residents, an increase is necessary.

This year alone we have had to repair the pool, the Tram, plumbing lines, air conditioning, ice machines, drinking fountains, gate arms, streets, and sidewalks, to name a few. We have had to trim, remove and/or maintain trees and perform many other day-to-day repairs.

There are a few projects that the Rec Board is currently looking into. The Rec is looking at repaving Friendly Valley Parkway (from Sierra Highway to Avenue of the Oaks) in the very near future. The office building roof is past its life and is badly in need of replacement. The common area Rec buildings need painting in order to prevent further deterioration. We are also currently looking into the installation of solar panels.

The Recreational Association's Reserve funds which include funding for streets, sidewalks, fencing, painting, roofs, plumbing, air conditioning, tree trimming, and emergencies would continue to receive \$1.00 per unit per month. Without an increase, we will not be able to continue to fund the Reserves.

Without an increase, the Board of Directors will have no choice but to drastically reduce or eliminate some amenities and services.

The Recreational Association is asking the membership to vote YES to increase the assessment from \$75.00 to \$80.00 in order to continue work that needs to be done, avoid discontinuing amenities and services that our residents currently enjoy, and to keep the facilities in good condition. Please consider these reasons when voting on the dues increase this October.
